

The Decline






High Ecological Status (HES) Objective

How do we determine which waters must achieve high status?

- Some sites may fluctuate naturally making it difficult to identify improvements or declines
- A HES objective waterbody should have achieved high status regularly
- If deterioration has occurred, it should only have occurred recently,
 i.e. since WFD monitoring commenced.
- For lakes, high ecological status at any time during the WFD monitored period was considered sufficient for assigning a high status objective








